

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY

Established in 2009, Shaheed BB University (SBBU) is located in a composed town of Sheringal at a distance of 28 km on the right of Dir City in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa (Pakistan) and 22 km from main Dir Timergara road. Situated on the right bank of river Panjkora, SBBU has a rich array of academic programs and research facilities to offer. Currently, with a strength of 3079 students and 148 faculty members (with 45 PhDs), we put forward a wide range of degree programs to the students and researchers.

Moreover, to preserve the local culture of Kohistani people, it has also maintained a museum in the village of Jandri near Thal. Our collection at the museum presents a splendid look into the past life of the local people. Similarly, in order to take the local people in the national mainstream, and to highlight their languages and cultures.

With an agenda of innovation, in teaching and research, SBBU has signed 30 MOUs with a number of local and international Universities, research centres and technology providers with expertise in its research interest areas. CHAPTER 1

UNIVERSITY GOVERNANCE

Shaheed Benazir Bhutto University, Sheringal, Dir Upper is governed under the Regulation 2009. The University Regulation 2009 authorized the University to establish certain authorities to supervise the matters of the University for its smooth functioning. Each of these authorities of the University is briefly introduced here with its key functions and powers:

1.1 Senate

Senate is the supreme governing body of the University. The total numbers its membership is twenty-one. All appointments to the Senate, other than ex-officio members, are made by the Chancellor from amongst a panel of three names for each vacancy, recommended by the Representation Committee, set up in terms of section 26 of the Regulation 2009. The Senate meets twice in a calendar year and the service on the Senate is honorary. The Registrar is the Secretary of the Senate. In the absence of the Chancellor, meetings of the Senate are presided over by such member, as the Chancellor may, from time to time, nominate.

The quorum for a meeting of the Senate is two-third of its membership, a fraction being counted as one. The Senate has the powers of general supervision over the University and holds the Vice-Chancellor and the Authorities accountable for all the functions of the University. The Senate has all powers of the University not expressly vested in an Authority or officer by the Regulation 2009 and all other powers not expressly mentioned in this Regulation that are necessary for the performance of its functions. The body has the powers to approve; the proposed annual plan of work, the annual and revised budgets, the annual report and the annual statement of accounts, hold, control over the property, funds and investments, oversee the quality and relevance of the University academic programs, academic affairs in general, approve the appointment of senior faculty and senior administrators as may be prescribed, institute schemes, directions and guidelines for the terms and conditions of appointment of all officers, teachers and other employees of the University, approve strategic plans, financial resource development plans, consider the drafts of Statutes and Bye-laws on the proposal of Syndicate and the Academic Council, make appointments of members of Syndicate & Academic Council, other than ex-officio members. The Senate may, subject to the provisions of the Regulation 2009, delegate all or any of the powers and functions of any Authority, officer or employee of the University. Total 6 meetings of the Senate were conducted so far while 01 in 2018-19.

1.3 Syndicate

The Syndicate is the executive body of the University and, subject to the provisions of the Regulation 2009 and the Statutes, exercises general supervision over the affairs and management of the University. The members of the Syndicate, other than ex-officio members, hold office for three years. The quorum for a meeting of the Syndicate is two-third of the total number of its members, a fraction being counted as one. The Syndicate meets at least once in each quarter of the year.

Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing powers and subject to the provisions of the Regulation, the Statutes and directions of the Senate, the Syndicate has to consider the annual report, the annual and revised budget estimates and to submit these to the Senate, transfer and accept transfer of movable and immovable property on behalf of the University, enter into, vary, carry out and cancel contracts on behalf of the University. Cause proper books of account to be kept for all sums of money received and expended by the University and for the assets and liabilities of the University, invest any money belonging to the University, grants, bequests, trust, gifts, donations, endowments etc, administer any funds, placed at the disposal of the University for specified purposes, provide the buildings, libraries, premises, furniture, apparatus, equipment and other means, required for carrying out the affairs of the University, establish and maintain halls of residence and hostels or approve or license hostels lodgings etc, recommend to the Senate the affiliation or disaffiliation of colleges, arrange for the inspection of colleges and the Departments, institute, create or suspend, abolish teaching/administrative positions, as may be necessary, prescribe the duties of officers, teachers and other employees of the University, report to the Senate on matters with respect to which it has been asked to report, appoint members to various Authorities in accordance with the provisions of this Regulation, propose drafts of statutes for submission to the Senate, regulate the conduct and discipline of the students of the University, take actions necessary for the good administration of the University in general and to this end exercise such powers as are necessary, delegate any of its powers to any Authority or officer or a committee; and perform such other functions as have been assigned to it by the provisions of the Regulation 2009 or the Statutes made there under. Total 17 meetings of the Syndicate were conducted so far while 02 in 2018-19.

1.5 Academic Council

The Academic Council is the principal academic body of the University and shall, subject to the provisions of the Regulation 2009 and the Statutes, has the powers to lay down proper standards of instruction, research and examinations and to regulate and promote the academic life of the University and the colleges. The Senate appoints the members of the Academic Council, other than the ex-officio members, on the recommendation of the Vice-Chancellor. Members of the Academic Council hold office for three years. The Academic Council meets at least once in six months. The Academic Council has the powers to approve the policies and procedures, pertaining to the quality of academic programs, approve academic programs, the policies and procedures, pertaining to students related functions, the policies and procedures, assuring quality of teaching and research, recommend the policies and procedures for affiliation of other educational institutions, propose to the Syndicate schemes for the constitution and organization of Faculties, Teaching departments and Boards of Studies, appoint paper setters and examiners for all examinations of the University, after receiving panels of names from the relevant authorities, institute programs for the continued professional development of University Teachers at all levels, recognize the examinations of other or examining bodies as equivalent to the corresponding examinations of the University, regulate the award of studentships, scholarships, exhibitions, medals and prizes, propose, from time to time, Bye-laws to the Senate on the recommendations of the Board of Faculties and the Board of Studies, prescribing the courses of studies, the syllabi and examinations, prepare an annual report on the academic performance of the University; and perform such functions as may be prescribed by Bye-laws. Total 4 meetings of the Academic Council were conducted so far while 01 in 2018-19.

1.7 Board of Faculties

There is a Board of each Faculty, which consists of: The Dean; The Professor and the Chairpersons of the Teaching Departments and Directors of Institutes; One Associate Professor, one Assistant Professor, and one Lecturer to be nominated by rotation in order of merit form each Department/Institute constituted in the Faculty; and Three teachers, to be nominated by the Academic Council, by reason of their specialized knowledge of the subjects which, though not assigned to the Faculty, have in opinion of the Academic Council, important bearing on the subjects assigned to the Faculty. The Board of each Faculty shall, subject to the general control of the Academic Council and the Syndicate, has the powers to co-ordinate the teaching, publication and research work in the subjects, assigned to the Faculty, scrutinize the recommendations of the Board of Studies, comprised in the Faculty in regard to the appointment of paper setters and examiners, except for research examinations and to forward the panels of suitable paper setters and examiners for each examination to the Vice-Chancellor, consider any other academic matter, relating to the report thereon to the Academic Council; and perform such other functions as may be assigned to it. Meeting of the Board of Faculty is not conducted till now.

1.8 Advanced Studies and Research Board

There is a board of Advance Studies and Research. The functions of the Advanced Studies and Research Board is to advise the Authorities on all matters connected with the promotion of Advanced Studies and Research in the University, consider and report to the Authorities on the institution of research degrees in the University, propose Bye-laws regarding the award of research degrees, appoint supervisors for postgraduate research students and to approve titles and synopses of their thesis dissertations, recommend panels of names of examiners for evaluation of their thesis and other research examinations; and perform such other functions as may be prescribed by Statutes. Total 5 meetings of the ASRB were conducted so far while 02 in 2018-19.

1.10 Selection Board

There is a Selection Board. The Selection Board, for teaching and other posts, considers the applications, received in response to an advertisement, and recommends to the Syndicate the names of the suitable persons, for appointment to teaching or other posts as the case may be and may also recommends the grant of a higher initial pay in suitable cases for reasons to be recorded, the appointment of an eminent qualified person to a position in the University on terms and conditions other than those prescribed; and cases of award of increments or cash award on the basis of research contribution as prescribed. The members, other than ex-officio members, holds office for three years. Total 8 meetings of the Selection Board were conducted so far, while Selection Board is not conducted in 2018-19.

1.11 Finance and Planning Committee

There is a Finance & Planning Committee which shall have to consider the annual statement of accounts and the annual and revised budget estimates and advise the Syndicate thereon, review

periodically the financial position of the University, advise the Syndicate on all matters relating to planning, development, finance, investment and accounts of the University; and perform such other functions as may be prescribed. Total 12 meetings of the F & PC were conducted so far while 02 in 2018-19.

1.13 Board of Studies (BoS)

There is a separate BoS for each subject or groups, as may be prescribed by Bye-laws. The functions of the BoS is to advise the Authorities on all academic matters, concerning instructions, publications, research and examinations in the subjects concerned, propose the curricula and syllabi for all degrees, diploma and certificate courses in the subjects concerned, suggest a panel of names of paper setters and examiners in the subjects concerned; and to perform such other functions as may be prescribed by Bye-laws. The term of office of members of the Board of Studies, other than ex-officio members, shall be three years. The quorum for meetings of the BoS, is one-half of the members.

1.14 Affiliation Committee

There is an Affiliation Committee which have to constitute an inspection committee to inspect the educational institution, seeking affiliation with or admission to the privileges of the University and to advise the Syndicate thereon; provided that the Affiliation Committee may itself inspect the institution concerned and advise the Syndicate accordingly, inquire into the complaints alleging breach of conditions of affiliation by affiliated colleges/affiliated institution and to advise the Syndicate thereon; and perform such other functions as may be prescribed by Bye-laws.

Industrial linkages with academic institutions play an important role in transformation of theoretical knowledge into practical experience and research into potential products that directly drives socioeconomic development. The SBBU, Sheringal accepts the importance of such linkages and thus participates regularly in science and technology exhibitions around the country and invites business leaders, industrialists and community leaders to its premises.

9.2 New Initiatives

Shaheed BB University is newly established in the year 2009. The University established the Office of Research, Innovation and Commercialization with High Tech Lab. Basic research infrastructure is already constructed and handed over to the departments i.e. Science labs for Pharmacy, Forestry, Chemical Science, Computer Science and Zoology.

9.3 Technology Incubation Centre

After establishment of ORIC, the University will now set up the business and technology incubation centres for SMEs, pharmaceutical plants, dairy farms, forestry plantation etc.

9.4 Patents

9.5 Internship and Placement Office

The University has planned to establish the Internship and Placements office in for guidance of its graduates. The office will help its graduates to seek internship in highly reputed national and international organizations.

9.6 Student Counseling and Career Guidance

The University has established Student Counseling and Career Guidance Dr. Mian Shah Bacha (HoD, Department of English) has been appointed as a focal person for Student Counseling and Career Guidance in March, 2018 for the establishment of the office, the TOR for the office shall be framed soon.

CHAPTER 10

STRENGTHENING PHYSICAL INFRASTRUCTURE

The strengthening physical infrastructure aimed to provide, strengthen and upgrade the existing academic, research and residential infrastructure which includes Academic Blocks, Hostels, Admin block, Canteens, Laboratories, Libraries, Student Hostels, ICT etc. Strengthening University infrastructures support, enable, and enhance the work of its faculty, staff, and students.

The Planning& Development Department, SBBU, Sheringal is planning comprehensively to provide modern academic, research and residential infrastructure to enable conducive learning and research environment in the University. Vehicles, furniture & fixtures, ICT, Lab and Office Equipments etc. are also purchased to make the campus facilities functional and contribute in the development of the University.

Note on Planning and Designing of the New Buildings

- A state of the art and beautifully designed Detail Master Plan having all the components of the Campus are prepared and implementation is already started. This Master Plan is the master piece, its preparation took 02 years with ACE Consultant, Project Staff and P&D section.
- The under-construction buildings in the PC-I/Project titled Development of University of Dir, Sheringal, Dir Upper shall be equipped with state-of-the-art modern requirements.
- All the buildings are designed on purpose built basis. Main entrances, emergency exists, and doors of large capacity halls are designed as open out or double swing position. Lift system is provided. At least 6 feet platform/landing space are provided before the stairs/ramps at main entrance and emergency exits. The ramp for disabled persons are provided at minimum 1:12 and it is not curved and all stair cases are straight and rect-

angular instead of winder.

- Emergency exists are provided in every building at all floors after every 60 feet distance and dead end are avoided. The washrooms for special persons are provided in each building with standard radius of at least 5.0 feet after fixtures for wheelchair to manoeuvre inside.
- Passive solar buildings are designed for maximum advantage of the local climate and sun light performing on accurate site analysis.
- As per building code requirements, the walls are constructed at a scale of R10, roof at R12 and tempered glass are used in the building.
- As this is seismic zone (Zone-III having moderate risk), therefore claddings are kept to a maximum of 4 feet height. Covered area, sun & wind path and north direction of each building/floor are clearly mentioned in the drawing.
- Standard room sizes have been designed in all buildings as per use of the room and halls. Every building has been designed according to its requirements.
- Two types of washrooms have been designed in every building, for general public and for disable persons.
- Other modern facilities like Diesel Generator Sets, Internal Networking and NVR System, Deep Freezers, Refrigerators, Electric Water Coolers, Exhaust Fans, Solar Water Heaters/Geysers, Electric Water Geysers, Cooking Range, Wardrobe/Almirah, Chullah/Burner, Fire Hydrant System, Fire Extinguishers (Liquid Type), Fire Extinguishers (Powder Type), Water Filters Three stages, Thunder Light Arresting System, CCTV system around the building and entrance as well as in corridors with day and night resolution, Telecommunication System, LCD Screen, Fire Alarm/Smoke Detector System are present in every building. Lighting system consist of WAPDA, Diesel Generator, Micro Hydel Power Generation will be provided to the buildings.

SBBU shall have to invest for faculty leadership capabilities to make them fully committed to the core academic values.

The increase/decrease in HEC grants & own resources/income as compared to 2016-17 was 5.50% and 2%. 15.4 Self-Generated Income

Our area is the backward/ scattered area with less population as compared to other hilly areas but still considerable increase in our own generated income was achieved. In the year 2014-15, it was Rs 98.532 million which went up to Rs 137.695 million in 2017-18. A part from 10% annual increase in students admissions /exam fee structure, new attractive programs at BS/MA/MSc and M-Phil has been started to optimize the utilization of available human resources (particularly the faculty/infrastructure) and to increase revenues. In this way we are providing quality education with comparatively low cost and increasing our income as well.

We are in the process of generating further revenue from our own resources like self-constructed shops/markets etc, by now it is meagre amount which will be improved in coming years. In the year 2016-17, our Booni sub-campus closed, due to which some decrease in the University total students happened. However, the major was due to the establishment of University of Chitral in July, 2017, as our around 450 students in the SBBU Sub-Campus Chitral shifted to that University. Due to concerted efforts, we achieved considerable increase in students at least to

keep our revenues at the same level as was for the year 2016-17, there was a decrease of only 2% in 2017-18. For the year 2018-19, we expect enrollment of around 2600 students with an increase of 22% in revenue i.e. Rs. 175.609 million.

16.2 Initiatives and Implementation

The University fully realized the importance of taking initiatives and implementing them for resource generation and development. The University has been active in making serious efforts to reduce its expenditures and increase the revenues for the development of University. These are highlighted here.

16.2.1 Students Aid Office at SBBU (Scholarships Program)

SBBU firmly believes in the promotion of the opportunities specifically for young, for young, talented and needy students to be able to pursue higher education at the post-graduate level. The University has established its Students Financial Aid office under the umbrella of Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC). This office mainly has the responsibility of scholarships execution, fund raising established public private linkages, providing students internships along with co-operative education program and developing alumni engagement program. To support SFAO Office dedicated fund are allocated in the recurring grant of the University.

Among other scholarships, the HEC- Funded Need Based Scholarships is particularly designed for the needy students to pursue their BS or MA/MSc degree at SBBU. The scheme has been initiated at SBBU in 2012-13 in response to the identified need of young students in the country who are deprived of the resources and opportunities to pursue and continue their education and as a consequence to enable them to contribute positively to their community and society.

16.2.3 Dairy Farm

Alongside the Poultry and Quail farm the University has also established a dairy farm. The capacity of Cows in dairy farm is 20, which on daily basis produce fresh milk up to 100 liters the farm also generate income for the University and also used for experimental purpose for the students of Zoology, Animal Science and others departments. In future, SBBU plans to expend this farm to a commercial level as well.

16.2.4 Students Endowment Fund (SEF)

SBBU have established students Endowment Fund (SEF). University employees contributed Rs. 0.2 Million in initial stage. Overall, SFAO was also established for the benefits of the students of the University under the direction of PEF Foundation US Inc. The foundation has promised to provide funding (worth one Million) and guidelines to SBBU SFAO.

16.2.5 University Guest House

The newly built guest house at SBBU, apart from fulfilling the need of the University can also benefit the University in term of resource generation.

16.3 Future Planes

As per government instruction, the University required to increase their own sources and minimize dependency on government funding. To maximize our own sources, we have the following future planes:

- 1. The Poultry, Quail and Dairy Farm which will be further extended to a larger level.
- 2. Trout fish hatchery to be constructed at Kumrat in near future.
- 3. As we have raw material of sand, stone etc., so a crush plant will be established to utilize the available raw materials for commercial as well as our own purposes
